Seed Bank

Because of substantial orders, we are now out of some of the seeds listed in the December newsletter. Those currently out of stock include the following aloes: *A. polyphylla, A. zebrina, A. broomii, A. microstigma, A. plicatilis* and *A. saudiarabica*. Also *Pelargonium* (mix). New stock should be in next month.

Most of the others listed last month remain available. In addition, we also have a few new items. These are: *Dyckia*, *Beaucarnia recurvata* (pony tail palm), *Encephalartos ferox*, *Cycas revoluta*, and *Mahonia aquifolium* (flowering evergreen shrub, 1x1.5m, exotic—Asia, North America, profuse yellow flowers on racemes followed by (edible) blue, black berries).
