
### PROPOSED NEW PLANT SALE FORMAT

There will be a new system introduced for the upcoming Plant Sale in May 2016.

The main problems we have faced are the congestion at point of sale, lack of negotiation space, shortage of wheelbarrows and helpers to shift the plants bought and sometimes it does take time to reconcile and pay out the sellers.

So after careful consideration of all suggestions, complaints and problem areas, we hope that this will assist in making the system smoother and more valuable to both our vendors and buyers.

- 1. ACSSZ will continue to perform the following services for the Plant Sale on Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> May 2016:
- Advertising in the Zimbabwe Gardener, Bambazonke, Facebook and with physical printed fliers
- Organisation, mapping, and demarcation of stands
- The sale and allocation of stands, on a first-come first-served basis, and the corresponding collection of stand fees before the event.
- Arrange overnight guards for the night of 28<sup>th</sup> May 2016 (*from 5pm 8am*) All plants and equipment that are left overnight remain so, at the Owner's risk.
- Arrange the hire of a portaloo, to be placed closer to the sales area, and to provide a member of staff on toilet duty
- Provide a few helpers with a few wheelbarrows to assist buyers
- Provide an ACSSZ desk where memberships may be renewed and Society information will be available. This year one of our representatives will not be found sleeping on this important job!
- 2. Sellers will no longer be required to pay 20% commission to the ACSSZ
- 3. The Plant Sale will remain focussed on the Sale of any Plants (ideally of the Aloe, Cactus, Succulent Cycad and Palm varieties) and materials that relate to this area. (The sale of alternate items is not permitted along with the Society's mandate and Sales agreements with the Botanical Gardens, and at all costs, we wish to avoid a "Car Boot" style sale.) The Society reserves the right to refuse any items that do not comply and to request the removal of such items.
- 4. Numbered Stands will be available for pre-purchase in the following sizes (and combinations thereof, with the premise being all stand depths are 4m.) The minimum stand size is 3m x 4m, however you are entitled to elect to share this with another vendor):
- Stand Hire fees: 3m x 4m = \$70.00 6m x 4m = \$140.00 9m x 4m = \$210.00
- The stands will be laid out at the Herbarium venue, in a horseshoe shape, a detailed layup plan is available. The MASTER PLAN is held and managed by Hans Wolbert and his decision is final.
- Plants must be set up by 5pm on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> May 2016, no late arrivals will be accepted
- The Sale is advertised from 09h00 13h00
- Stands must be paid by 22nd May to secure your stand
- 4. Sellers will no longer need to check plants in or out all plants are the responsibility of the Seller. **ACSSZ will not be held responsible for any loss of plants.**
- 5. Sellers are free to replenish plants at any stage of the day, so long as it does not disrupt any other Sellers or Buyers.
- 6. Sellers will price their plants in their own fashion, and provide a float and collect all monies from sales for their plants (and invoices upon request)
- 7. We recommend that plants are priced no less than \$1 to assist in your 'change' management
- 8. Sellers reserve the right to change their prices or to set multiple prices (eg. 2 plants may be sold for less than twice the price of one.)
- 9. Sellers may elect to setup a gazebo / tables for the layup of their stand, on condition it is contained within the designated stand area and does not impact upon the neighbour in any negative manner.
- 10. Sellers are **strongly** encouraged to bring along a helper/s and wheelbarrow/s to assist their buyers in moving plants to vehicles. Customers can freely move their plants out after purchase.
- 11. Company advertisement is permitted, providing it does not obstruct or impact on any of the other Sellers
